Maya and her sister saw their father hurt their mother more times than they could count. A protective order was in place, but their mother was not adhering to the Department of Social Services' safety plan.

“I need money and transportation.”

Maya's mom was financially dependent on her abuser. To ensure Maya's safety, her CASA Advocate helped recommend the resources their family needed to escape from domestic violence.

Maya and her sister now live in peace.

Matty was taken from his birth mother as an infant when she tested positive for drug use. She contested the results, but by then, Matty was already living in foster care.

Matty's CASA Advocate met with both Matty and his birth mother regularly, documenting the steps she took to reunite with her child. These details were submitted to the Judge, and CASA ultimately recommended that Matty be returned to his birth mother.

82% of expenses directly fund our program.

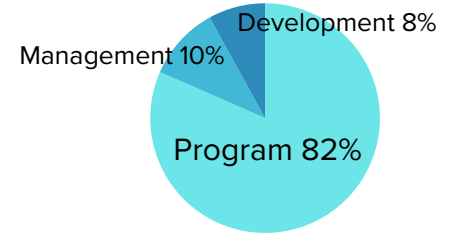
In addition, using volunteer advocates amplifies the value of every dollar spent and reinforces our position as a vital resource to Henrico County.

EXPENSES: \$815,888



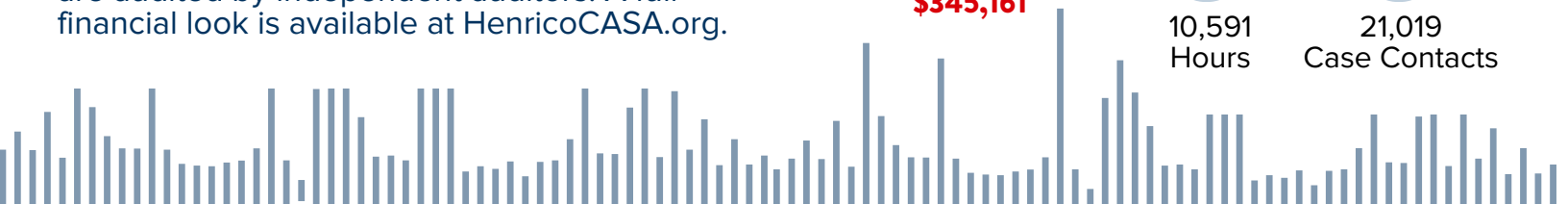
